journalist, brother of **Archibald Bremner**, was born at Hants, Trinity Bay, Newfoundland, October 11, 1847, and is of Anglo-Scotch descent. Coming with his parents to Ontario in 1856, he became a practical printer. Joining the reporting staff of the *London Free Press*, 1865, he was afterward assistant editor of that journal, and on the death of **Josiah Blackburn**, 1890, was chosen to succeed him as editor-in-chief of the Free Press. In this position he has done much to sustain the high character previously earned by the paper under **Mr. Blackburn** and others.
