Rory Bremner

Impressionist and comedian. Born in Morningside district of Edinburgh, the son of an army officer, **Bremner** was educated at Clifton Hall boarding school near Ratho. He first appeared at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe in the late 1970s. His versatility in being able to impersonate a vast array of personalities, from royalty to politicians, both male and female, brought him to prominence. **Bremner** began his television career on the comedy puppet show *Spitting Image* in 1984. He has been a regular on *Whose Line Is It Anyway* (1988) and **Have I Got News For You** (1992) and has had several series of his own on BBC and Channel 4 television.
