### Probation Officer Seeking Donald Bremner to Reunite Him With Brother from England

**Mrs. J.L. Pickering**, head probation officer of the Juvenile Court in this city, has been endeavoring to obtain some information as to the whereabouts of **Donald Bremner**, who in July, 1908 resided at 1634 South Eighteenth street. **Mrs. Pickering** is endeavoring to locate the man on the strength of a communication from **H.L. Weir**, chief probation officer of Hamilton county, Cincinnati, O. who is acting on behalf of **John Bremner**, aged 16, 03 36 Queen's Gate News (sic), London, Eng., a brother of **Donald**.

**Mr. Weir** in his letter informs **Mrs. Pickering** that **John Bremner** came to this country to find his brother. At Mobile he fled the tramp freight steamer Eversley, on which he was traveling, and wandered around for some time, finally landing in Ohio. He was picked up in Cincinnati, and is being detained by **Mr. Wolf** in the hope that something may develop that would lead to the location of the missing man.

**Mrs. Pickering** from information furnished her, learned that **Donald** was formerly employed as a motorman by the Philadelphia Rapid Transit Company. Inquiries at the address at which he formerly lived showed that he had removed to a house on Tasker st., but when **Mrs. Pickering** called there to interview him she was again told that he had taken up his residence at some other place. Since that time nothing has been heard of him.
