MONUMENT TO THE LATE Mr. JAMES BREMNER

“We understand that a monument of considerable dimensions and elegance is about to be erected in Wick churchyard to the memory of the late **Mr. James Bremner, C.E.** The monument, which is from the works of **McDonald**, Aberdeen, and is cut from blocks of the finest Aberdeenshire granite, is at present under cover in the churchyard, previous to erection; and, from the space it occupies, it will apparently, when put up, form one of the most striking objects in the burial ground, contiguous as it will be to the handsome pillar erected above the grave of **Mr. Bremner’s** son, **Mr. David Bremner**, engineer to the Clyde Commissioners. Among other gravestones of elegant design which have lately been erected in the churchyard we notice two by **Messrs. Henderson and Craig**, stone-cutters, to the memory of their parents. The stones are in each case neatly carved, and are surmounted by draperied urns, and are very creditable specimens of local art.”
