**Charles G. Balmanno** Suffers a Triple Fracture of the Arm in Philadelphia.

Philadelphia, Pa., October 4 – **Charles G. Balmanno**, paying teller of the Fulton Bank, Brooklyn, is confined in the Hahnemann Hospital here, suffering from a triple fracture of the arm. He visited this city last Saturday on business connected with his bank and was on his way home when the accident happened. Having some time to spare before his train left, he went to the barber shop under the Broad street station, and in ascending the stone steps his foot slipped and he fell backward. He was picked up, carried back into the barber shop, and an ambulance from the Hahnemann Hospital took him to that institution where it was discovered that his right arm was broken in three places above the elbow. It will probably be a week before he will be in a condition to be removed to his home in Brooklyn.
